

# Beaded Sugar Cookie Crochet Pattern



- ~ Quick and fun project!
- ~ Cookies look yummy enough to eat!
- ~ Great for little girls to play with in their kitchen.
- ~ For girls under 3 - use yarn sprinkles instead of beads.
- ~ Finished cookie is approx. 3 ½" in diameter.

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# Beaded Sugar Cookie Crochet Pattern

## MATERIALS

- F crochet hook
- Worsted weight yarn:
  - Beige or light tan for cookie
  - Pink for frosting
- Czech glass beads #2 Straight Bugle in Fuchsia
- Beading needle
- Pink embroidery floss
- Fiberfill or wool (optional)
- Yarn needle
- Stitch marker
- Hot glue gun & glue (optional)

## STITCHES USED

ch = chain  
sc = single crochet  
dc = double crochet  
inv dec = invisible decrease (see pg. 4)  
st = stitch  
sts = stitches  
sl st = slip stitch  
sp = space  
FO = fasten off

## GAUGE

Not essential to this pattern.

## PATTERN NOTES

\* This pattern is worked in a continuous spiral stitch. You will need to mark the last st of the round with a safety pin or stitch marker. Do not join rounds unless instructed to do so!

## PATTERN

### COOKIE

**Round 1:** With beige yarn, ch 2. 6 sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook. (6 sc)

**Round 2:** 2 sc in next sc and each sc around. (12 sc)

**Round 3:** \*2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc\*, repeat from \* to \* around. (18 sc)

**Round 4:** \*2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc\*, repeat from \* to \* around. (24 sc)

**Round 5:** \*2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc\*, repeat from \* to \* around. (30 sc)

**Round 6:** \*2 sc in next sc, sc in next 4 sc\*, repeat from \* to \* around. (36 sc)

**Round 7:** \*2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc\*, repeat from \* to \* around. (42 sc)

**Round 8:** \*2 sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc\*, repeat from \* to \* around. (48 sc)

**Round 9:** Sc in next sc and each sc around. (48 sc)

**Round 10:** \*Inv dec, sc in next 6 sc\*, repeat from \* to \* around. (42 sc)

**Round 11:** \*Sc in next 5 sc, inv dec\*, repeat from \* to \* around. (36 sc)

**Round 12:** \*Inv dec, sc in next 4 sc\*, repeat from \* to \* around. (30 sc)

**Round 13:** \*Sc in next 3 sc, inv dec\*, repeat from \* to \* around. (24 sc)

**Round 14:** \*Inv dec, sc in next 2 sc\*, repeat from \* to \* around. (18 sc)

**\*\*Stuff cookie just a little bit if you want to.\*\***

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**Round 15:** \*Sc in next sc, inv dec\*, repeat from \* to \* around. (12 sc)

**Round 16:** Inv dec around. (6 sc)

**To Finish:** Sl st in next sc, FO and weave in tail.

## FROSTING

**Round 1:** With pink yarn, ch 2. 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6 sc)

**Round 2:** 2 sc in next sc and each sc around. (12 sc)

**Round 3:** \*2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc\*, repeat from \* to \* around. (18 sc)

**Round 4:** \*2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc\*, repeat from \* to \* around. (24 sc)

**Round 5:** \*3 dc in next sc, skip next sc, sc in next sc\*, repeat from \* to \* around.

**To Finish:** Sl st in next st, leaving a length of tail for sewing, FO. Note: If you are going to hot glue the Frosting on the cookie, weave in tails instead of leaving a length for sewing.

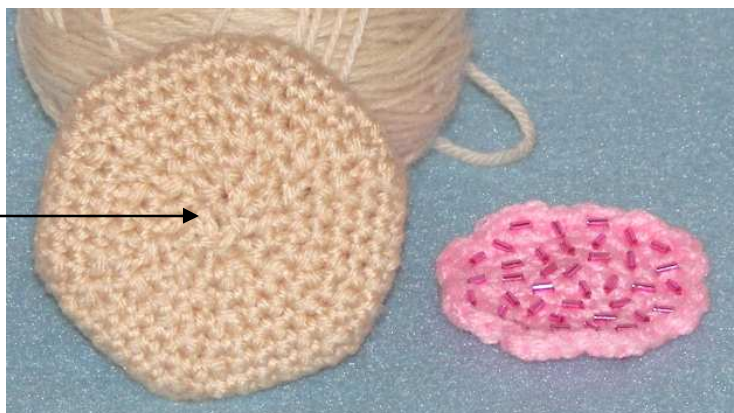
## SEW ON BEADS

1. Using beading needle and 2 strands of pink floss, sew beads on top of frosting scattered around.

## FINAL ASSEMBLY

1. Flatten cookie and position ending sts (Rounds 15-16) in the center (*see picture below*).
2. Sew or hot glue frosting, centered on the cookie, covering the ending sts.
3. That's it! You have a beautiful beaded sugar cookie that looks good enough to eat!

Ending stitches,

## **INVISIBLE DECREASE EXPLANATION**

Insert hook through the **FRONT LOOP ONLY** of the first st, yo, and pull up a loop (2 loops on hook). Then insert your hook into the **FRONT LOOP ONLY** of the second st, yo, and pull up a loop (3 loops on hook). Finally, yo, and pull through all 3 loops on your hook.

***Note:** I have just recently started using this method of decreasing and I do believe it produces a better looking product. If you don't want to use this method, you can use the standard single crochet decrease, which is crocheting 2 sts together.*
