Flower Bath Puff Crochet Pattern

MATERIALS

- 2 ounces worsted weight 100 % cotton yarn, such as Sugar 'n Cream
- I crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Scissors



STITCHES

- Ch = chain
- Sc = single crochet
- Dc = double crochet
- Sl st = slip stitch
- St = stitch
- Sts = stitches
- Sp = space
- FO = fasten off

PATTERN NOTES

- The flower bath puff has 3 sections to it. Two flower pieces and one hanging loop. After all 3 sections are completed, the bath puff is sewn together using your yarn needle and length of tail.
- If you want a bigger bath path, use an J crochet hook. You will need 3 oz. of yarn for the bigger puff. If you want a smaller bath puff, use a size H crochet hook. You will need a little less than 2 ounces of yarn for the smaller puff.

FLOWER PATTERN

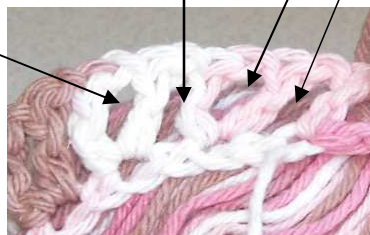
****Make 2 Flowers****

Row 1: Ch. 53. Dc in 5th ch from hook, ch 1. Skip next ch. *dc, ch 1, dc, ch 1 in next ch. Skip next ch.* Repeat from * to * across. *This sequence of sts makes a V stitch.* Ch 3, turn. (50 dc or 25 V sts made)

**** Note:** *In Row 2, you will be working in the ch-1 spaces throughout the row. ***

Row 2: 5 dc in first ch-1 space (*the ch 3 counts as 1 dc to equal 6 dc in this space*). Sc in next ch-1 space. *6 dc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next ch-1 space*. Repeat from * to * across. *This sequence of sts makes a Shell st.* (25 shells made) To finish, ch 1. Leaving approximately 30 inches of tail, cut yarn, pull through loop and tighten.

4 arrows point to ch-1 spaces to show you what they look like.

TO ASSEMBLE FLOWERS *(repeat these instructions for the second flower)*

1. Thread long tail of one of the flower strands through your yarn needle.
2. With the front side of sts facing you, roll the end up 3 times and sew in place with a couple of sts. Continue to roll a few more times and sew to continue forming the flower.



3. Start flattening out the flower now. Continue to roll, wrap and sew. To better secure the flower, sew the petals to the row above. Note: You will not see your sewing stitches as long as you keep them about 1 inch away from the outer edges.

5. Continue to sew the petals together until you get close to the end of the tail. You want to make sure the petals are secure so that your bath puff doesn't come apart when using or washing. I also run a few stitches to the center of the flower to secure in place.



6. After you are done sewing the flower, take the 2 tails on the back of flower and knot together several times. Trim tails.



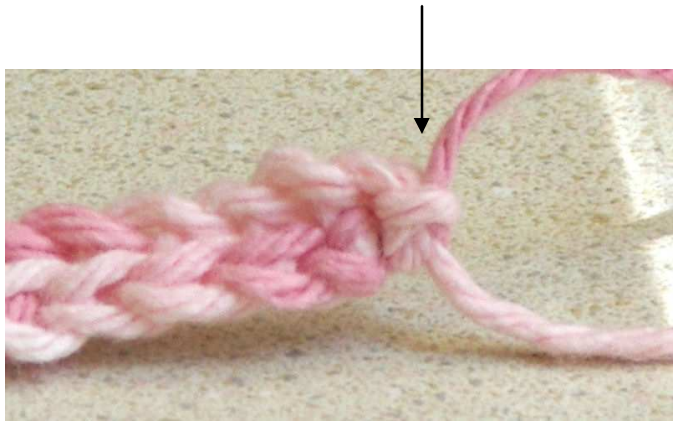
7. Repeat steps 1-6 to make second flower. Be sure that the second flower resembles the first flower in size and shape. After the second flower is made, you will have the front and back of the puff. Set these two flowers aside for now.

HANGING LOOP INSTRUCTIONS

1. With your yarn and size I crochet hook, ch 40.
2. Sl st in second ch from hook and each remaining ch.
3. Ch 1, leaving a 35 inch length of tail for sewing, cut yarn and pull through loop.
4. Tie and knot two tails together.



5. Thread longest tail into your yarn needle. Sew the two ends of the hanging loop together with a few stitches. Try to catch the other (short) tail in these stitches. Or, you can simply weave it in. **DO NOT** cut yarn. Your hanging tail should look like the one in the picture below:

BATH PUFF ASSEMBLY

1. Position the hanging loop on the back of one of the flowers about 1 inch from the top of a petal and sew in place. **DO NOT** fasten off or cut yarn. You will sew the bath puff together using this same tail.



2. Place the flowers wrong sides (back of flowers) together with petals matching up. Begin sewing the two flowers together only using the top stitches of the last row of petals. No other petals will be sewn together except for the very last row of each flower. Continue sewing the flowers together until you have sewn all the way around the puff.

Only sew together the last row of petals, using the top stitches.

3. After the two flowers are sewn together, work the yarn needle and tail back through the puff, knot tail several times, and weave in. Repeat this step 2-3 times to secure puff together.
4. Finished! Now admire and enjoy your new flower bath puff! ☺



WASHING/CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Wash with like items (t-shirts) on gentle cycle, in cold water. Tumble dry low or lay flat to dry. These puffs should last for quite some time if cared for properly.
